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# Sensitive to industry concerns: Shah

Fiscal puritanism must not be allowed to sacrifice growth, caution experts

In a bid to allay apprehensions of India Inc., Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said the government was looking into the "difficulties" faced by industries, even as several experts suggested pumping in more money into the sagging economy. "I understand your difficulties, your apprehensions. There may be uncertainties. But it is a sensitive and non-corrupt government," Shah said at an All India Management Association (AIMA) event here. He also attributed some of the challenges faced by businesses to the global economic slowdown.

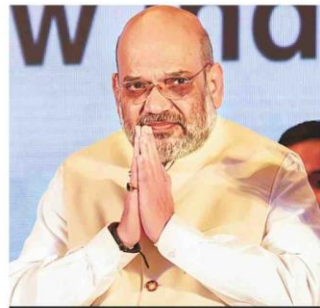
Speaking on the reforms initiatives, Shah said the initial difficulties faced in systems like the goods and services tax regime would smoothen out soon. "...at the end reforms bring the larger good," the minister said, as he asked the AIMA and other industry bodies to

come up with suggestions to give industries a boost. "India has to be a \$5-trillion economy by 2024 and it is a certainty," he said, urging business leaders to build national confidence.

### 'Pump in more money'

Later, experts deliberated on the need for fiscal expansionary policy at a time when the GDP growth rate has hit a six-year low of 5.5 per cent. "Banks are not short of funds, but NBFCs (non-banking financial companies) are. Liquidity should be infused there to increase consumer lending, even if it means widening of fiscal deficit," suggested Akhil Bansal, deputy CEO at KPMG in India, at the panel discussion.

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Sanjiv Mehta as saying that "you can't say FMCG is recession-proof but it is recession-resistant" to support his argument. Whether fiscal deficit be widened to 3.5 per cent from the budgetary projection of 3.3 per cent for the current fiscal year is a matter of discussion, he said. The Centre will anyway get ₹1.76 trillion from the Reserve Bank of India, Ranade said.

Vikram Singh Mehta, chairman of Brookings India & senior fellow at Brookings Institution, said the fiscal space should be expanded to perk up demand and drive investments. He said the government should disburse the entire amount (₹75,000 crore) earmarked for the PM-KISAN in this year's Budget.

A panellist, however, cautioned that

economic growth driven by expanding fiscal deficit would not be sustainable. He was of the view that fiscal deficit was much higher than shown by the government. He cited a report by the Comptroller and Auditor General, pointing out that the Centre's fiscal deficit actually worked out to be 5.85 per cent in 2017-18, as against 3.46 per cent shown by the government. If one adds states' fiscal deficit of 3.1 per cent, the country's fiscal deficit would come to close to 9 per cent.

Higher borrowings by the government to finance fiscal deficit would not let interest rates to go down, he said.

On whether policymakers settle for a high growth-high inflation scenario or a low growth-low inflation scenario, Ranade said he does not think there is a trade-off between the two. ## Will never compromise on nation's security: Shah

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NEW DELHI

The decision to abrogate provisions of Article 370, which granted special status to Jammu and Kashmir, was taken by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to reintegrate India in keeping with the vision of "One India", Union home minister Amit Shah said on Tuesday.

"Today this is a decisive and determined and non-corrupt government. Whether it was the decision of an air strike or surgical strike, there are a lot of decisions that have to be considered such as what if there is war and what if something goes wrong. We decided that we would never compromise with the security of this country," Shah said at an event organized by the All India Management Association.

"These strikes changed the way the world looked at us. Earlier, they thought our defence and internal security plans barely existed but then they became an integral part of our policy making. Our very detractors told us that nobody could breach our borders and today if even a single soldier sheds his blood it is very important for us," he said.

Till 17 September, not one bullet had been fired in Kashmir and peace prevailed in the valley, despite the teething problems in big policy decisions, said the home minister.

India is progressing very quickly economically, especially with regard to infrastructure, agriculture, rural electrification, and per capita income, he said. "We are progressing towards becoming a \$5 trillion economy and we will be so before 2024. We are confident of that," Shah said.

"New India" is Modi's brainchild, Shah said. "In five years there have been several changes. In 2014, India had been independent for about seven decades. When we came to power, we studied several democracies across the world and we adopted the best one with the aim of a multi-party democratic system meant to further national progress," Shah said.

In 2013, when the United Progressive Alliance government was in power, there were cases of "corruption everyday worth ₹12 lakh crore (₹12 trillion), there was no security, our soldiers were taking the hit, internal security was in shambles and people were protesting everyday. The country had a government where every person considered himself the Prime Minister", he said.

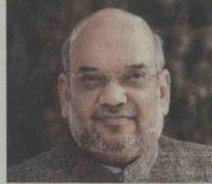

# Global players draining out of Indian economy

Largest retraction witnessed since 1999 as pessimism grows among investors, public

**#NEWDELHI**

The flailing Indian economy — repercussions of which have been witnessed for five quarters — is now showing signs of global repercussions. The aftermath has been building for the last six years, since Prime Minister Narendra Modi's arrival to power, when \$45 billion were poured into the stock market looking at the economic potential. Now, the situation circling the drain with the international money managers pulling out at a never-before-seen pace. According to a *Bloomberg* report, they have sold \$4.5 billion of Indian shares since June — the "biggest quarterly exodus since at least 1999".

At present, car sale and capital investments have nosedived. The unemployment rate is the highest almost 50 years and the banking sector is marred with bad loan ratio. These factors have invited scathing critiques from economists all over the world. For instance, *Bloomberg* recorded a statement from Salman Ahmed, a London-based chief investment strategist, which pointed at Modi's "fading euphoria".

Investors have been claiming that Modi has been slow to act on much-needed reforms around labour laws and selling of state-owned companies. However, if the pace continues, growth plans for international firms might



take a hit, directly affecting jobs. Furthermore, his decisions of demonetisation and introduction of goods and service tax have been criticised. The recent efforts in escalating the growth are focussed on short-term goals as the US-China trade war weighs on emerging markets globally.

However, this fiscal ammunition is hampered by budget deficits and indebted state-owned companies. This has caused his own advisors to issue cautionary and shift his focus on major reforms. "Structural reforms will be critical for higher GDP growth as the government may have largely exhausted the fiscal and monetary options," said Sanjeev Prasad, an analyst at Kotak Institutional Equities in Mumbai.

This, however, has not stopped from loyal supporters to issue generalised statements on how the govern-

ment is harnessing every bit to promote economic growth. An example of this can be seen in Niti Aagoy CEO Amitabh Kant's statement reported by *PTI* on September 18.

"If you look at the last five years, India's growth on an average was of about 7.5 per cent. The growth story has dipped to five per cent in the first quarter of the fiscal year 2019-20. Both, the Reserve Bank of India and the government of India are active on this. We need to think what kind of innovation we need to undertake to attain a high trajectory growth," Kant said while delivering keynote address on 'Fostering a Culture of Innovation' at an All India Management Association event.

Whereas RBI has brought down the repo rate by 110 basis points, the government took a series of measures and gave three economic boosters, he said, adding it will continue to do so.

"The government is active, the fundamentals of Indian economy are intact and we will continue to do whatever it required to take India back to high trajectory growth rate," Kant said.

This has left room for investors, who want to see certain kinds of change. Their desires include privatisation of more state-run companies, easier hiring and firing of workers, loose restrictions on land purchases and so on.

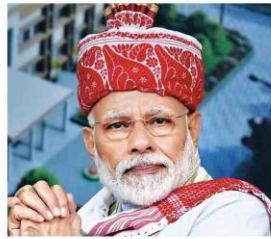

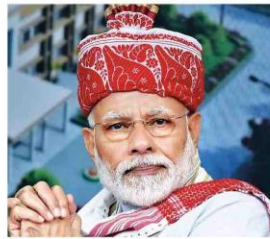

# Shah questions multi-party democracy

**Cites inefficacy of previously elected govts to push for two-party system**

In controversial remarks raising questions on the efficacy of multi-party parliamentary democracy, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday claimed there are doubts in the minds of people about the existing system now and whether it will help in achieving the goals of a welfare state set by founding fathers.

He questioned the achievements of governments of 30 years, including coalition dispensations between 1989 and 2014, saying they could not take even five big decisions while the Modi government has taken "more than 50 big decisions" in last five years.

Shah's statement at the 46th National Management Convention organised by All India Management Association comes three days after he raised another controversy when he pitched for 'One Nation, One Language' to make Hindi as the national language.

The latest remarks could fuel further controversy, as Opposition has been accusing the BJP of trying to tamper with the multi-party system in the country and bring in a two-party system. Earlier, BJP had advocated two-party system and never hid its preference for changing parliamentary democracy into Presidential form of government.

Shah said Modi got a historic mandate in 2014 and become the first

non-Congress party to have numbers on its own in Lok Sabha in the history of independent India.

Noting that founding fathers had adopted a multi-party parliamentary democratic system after putting a lot of thought and looking into the systems of various countries, he said, "the aim of the multi-party system is to create a welfare state...The target of the founding fathers was to create a state where all are equal and all got equal opportunity. This is the essence what we get when we go through the debates of the Constituent Assembly debates."

"But after 70 years of independence, there are questions in minds of people whether the multi-party Parliamentary democratic system has failed. Will it help build an India envisioned by framers of our Constitution? There is a huge disappointment," he said.

Referring to 2013, a year before the Lok Sabha elections, Shah said news of scams and corruption were tumbling out day after day and the country's border as well as inside were insecure.

"Our soldiers were beheaded and insulted, women were unsafe, youth were disillusioned, people were protesting. There were protests by Anna Hazare and Ramdev...There was policy paralysis. Till 2013, there was a government in which every minister considered himself a prime minister but did not think of prime minister as prime minister," he said.

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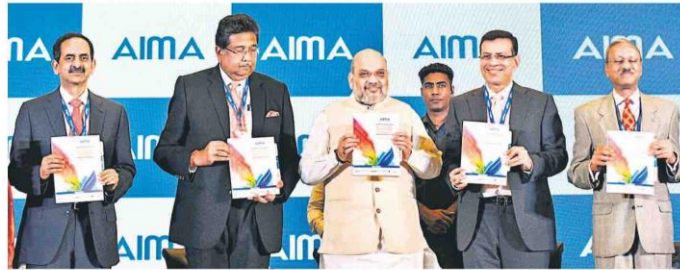

## Modi Govt sensitive, aware of concerns of industries: Shah

Trying to allay apprehensions of India Inc, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said the Modi government is "sensitive" and looking into the difficulties being faced by businessmen, including those related to reforms initiatives. "We are trying to help you... but there is a global slowdown too," he said.

The Home Minister said the Modi government works for the welfare of both the agricultural sector as well as industries. He asked the AIMA and other industry bodies to come up with suggestions for the government on what to do for the industries. The government would do its best for the benefit of industries, he said.

Shah urged the AIMA, FICCI and ASSOCHAM to devote more energy for research and development initiatives. He said the Modi government was not run by bureaucrats but by political executives. "The political leadership takes the policy decisions and the bureaucrats implement them," he said.

In an interview to Al Jazeera channel, Khan had reiterated that nuclear war between the two neighbours was a possibility. "When two nuclear-armed countries fight, if they fight a conventional war, there is every possibility that it is going to end up in nuclear war. The unthinkable."

Earlier, speaking at the 46th National Management Convention held by All India Management Association, Shah spoke about the bold decision-making on national security and said though every Indian feels proud when steps like surgical strikes and air strikes are taken, it is a fine line that the government has to tread and ensure that nothing goes wrong.
